Western Contra Costa Transit Authority Anticipated Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Goal Federal Fiscal Years 2022-23 thru 2024-25

<u>SUMMARY</u>

WCCTA is a recipient of United Sates Department of Transportation (U.S. DOT) federal funds (WCCTA does not have subrecipients). As such, and in accordance with Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 26 (49 CFR Part 26), Western Contra Costa Transit Authority (WCCTA) implements a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program to ensure nondiscrimination in the award of federally funded contracts. As part of this program, WCCTA must establish a triennial goal for DBE participation in all contracts that are to be funded with Federal Transit Administration (FTA) funds. A DBE firm is defined as a for-profit "small business concern" that is at least 51 percent owned and controlled by one or more socially and economically disadvantaged individuals. DBE firms are certified as such through Unified Certification Programs established in each state.

During the triennial period FFY 2023-2025, WCCTA anticipates using the majority of its federal funding to purchase rolling stock, which is not subject to the goal setting process. However, as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, WCCTA received federal funds to specifically assist with Operations. These funds will be used to supplement the cost of providing fixed-route operations as well as mandated ADA paratransit. WCCTA currently contracts its fixed-route and paratransit service to one private contractor, MV Transit, and applies the ADA operating assistance toward supplementing the costs of operating ADA paratransit service. Within the next triennial period, WCCTA will also expend additional federal funds to support fixed-route service.

With limited contracting opportunities and no DBEs available in WCCTA's local area market to perform transit operations, the Anticipated Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Goal for this triennial period is zero (0) percent. WCCTA will also continue to participate in program outreach to DBEs and Small Business Enterprises (SBEs) using funds received from sources other than the FTA. However, this goal only details new contracting opportunities planned with FTA funds

DEVELOPMENT OF ANTICIPATED DBE GOAL

As an eligible recipient of federal funding, WCCTA is required to comply with 49 CFR Part 26, which states that grantees must establish and implement a DBE program and set triennial DBE participation goals.

While disadvantaged business opportunities for federally funded projects during the triennial period 2023-2025 are not anticipated, WCCTA will continue to seek small and disadvantaged business participation on contracts, regardless of funding source.

However, only those contracts planned to fund all or in part with FTA funds, are included in the triennial goal development.

The methodology to calculate the DBE participation goal is a two-step process described in 49 CFR Part 26. Step-One of the methodology establishes a base figure for the anticipated contracts to be awarded in the period. The base figure is derived from the relative availability of DBEs that are ready, willing and able to participate on these anticipated contracts. Step-Two relies on WCCTA's knowledge of its contracting markets and previous history of DBE participation to determine if an adjustment to the base figure is needed. The calculation using the two-step methodology results in a DBE Goal of zero (0) percent for FFY 2023 FFY 2025. This methodology is outlined in Attachment 1.

The Overall DBE goal is typically split into race-neutral and race-conscious components. Race-neutral participation occurs when a DBE obtains a contract or subcontract through customary procurement procedures where there was no contract goal or its DBE status was not considered in making the award. Race-conscious DBE participation is the portion of the overall goal that focuses on assisting only DBEs, where a contract's DBE goal is explicitly stated to encourage DBE participation. WCCTA will continue to operate a Race-neutral DBE Program. WCCTA will also continue to supplement its DBE Program with a Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program.

OUTREACH/PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

In accordance with the public participation requirements of 49 CFR Part 26.45, and having received Board approval, WCCTA has posted its DBE Goal on its official website. See Attachment 2.

WCCTA has sought and encouraged public participation input from minority, women's and general contractor groups, through its participation as a member of the BOC (Business Outreach Committee). This consortium of 26 Bay Area Transit and Transportation Agencies assists Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBEs) and other small companies with expansion of their businesses through training, technical assistance, and relationship-building with agency staff and the contracting community of the San Francisco Bay Area. WCCTA attends monthly BOC meetings and contributes to the achievement of BOC projects.

On April 11 & 26, 2022, WCCTA participated in the BOC's Public Participation Meetings that provided members of the public with the opportunity to learn about upcoming transportation projects and provide input on the goal-setting process for federally assisted contracts for Federal Fiscal Years (FFY) 2022-23 through 2024-25 (Event summary Attachment 3). These meetings were attended by regional transit agencies where vendors, contractors and government contracting personnel from these transit agencies met to discuss upcoming projects and exchange information on how to connect with these agencies for contracting opportunities. WCCTA continues to seek

on-going public participation from community organizations through public meetings and public planning documents comment periods on up-coming projects. Publication of outreach events is presented in Attachment 4.

WCCTA's public participation and outreach activities are designed to broaden awareness of WCCTA's Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program beyond federal dollars. Furthermore, the measures described in 49 C.F.R. Part 26.51, focusing on race-neutral means will be actively pursued, and WCCTA will encourage its contractors to also make similar outreach efforts to include DBE participation in subcontracting opportunities. In addition to consultation with the BOC and CUCP, WCCTA will continue to organize and offer informational programs for establishing DBE goals, meeting DBE eligibility requirements, familiarizing potential contractors with WCCTA procurement procedures and requirements, and to otherwise develop, effective programs to further the inclusion of DBEs in all WCCTA contracting activities. These efforts include but are not limited to face-to-face, interactive meetings with local minority/small business organizations

Summary of public outreach comments

WCCTA did not receive any comments during or after the public participation process therefore no changes to the goal were made.

ANTICIPATED DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE) GOAL METHODOLOGY: FFY 2022-23 THRU 2024-25

The methodology to calculate an agency's DBE goal is a two-step process described in 49 CFR Part 26. Step-One of the methodology establishes a base figure for new federally funded contracts anticipated to be awarded in the upcoming three Federal Fiscal Years (October 1 – September 30). This calculation has been done for contracts anticipated to be awarded between October 1, 2022 and September 30, 2025.

The base figure is derived from the relative availability of DBEs that are ready, willing, and able to participate on these anticipated contracts. Step-Two relies on the agency's knowledge of its contracting markets and previous history of DBE participation to determine if an adjustment to the base figure is needed. The calculation using the two-step methodology results in an Anticipated DBE Goal of 0% for FFY's 2023-2025 for the WCCTA. This methodology is outlined below.

Step-One Process: Development of Base Figure

The initial step in developing an Anticipated DBE Goal is to determine the market area for consultants who have demonstrated an interest, or are anticipated to participate in WCCTA contracts. WCCTA's market area consists of the nine Bay Area counties: Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Napa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Solano and Sonoma.

WCCTA's service area comprises just over 20 square miles of West Contra Costa County, including the cities of Pinole and Hercules and the unincorporated areas of Montalvin Manor, Bayview, Tara Hills, Rodeo, Crockett, and Port Costa. The area is bounded to the north by the Carquinez Strait, the city limits of Pinole and Hercules to the east, the Richmond city border to the south, and by San Pablo Bay to the west. In addition, WCCTA operates regional service between Martinez and the Hercules Transit Center, Transbay service between the Hercules Transit Center and the San Francisco Transbay Terminal, and regional service between the Hercules Transit Center and Contra Costa College. Currently, population in the WCCTA service area is approximately 73,000 inhabitants. The nine-county Bay Area is the most appropriate market area for WCCTA to use in its goal-setting methodology.

During the triennial period FFY 23-25, WCCTA anticipates using the majority of its federal funding to purchase rolling stock, which is not subject to the goal setting process. However, WCCTA has been provided with federal relief funds to support Opearations, in addition to supplemental funds to supplement the cost of providing ADA service. WCCTA currently contracts Operations to one private contractor, MV Transit, to provide both fixed route and paratransit service. To determine the number of DBEs available to perform this service in WCCTAs nine county market area, WCCTA searched the California Department of Transportation's CUCP database for DBEs that are certified in the identified NAICS code. To determine the number of all firms (DBEs and non-DBEs) in the nine county market area, WCCTA searched the United States Census Bureau's most recent California Business Patterns (CBP) database for all firms in the identified NAICS code. The ratio of DBE firms to non-DBE firms is then calculated by dividing the number of DBEs available in a particular NAICS code by the number of all firms in that NAICS code.

Finally, the Step-One Base Figure results from multiplying the DBE ratios group by the corresponding weight, and summing the results. The calculation of the Step-One Base Figure is shown in Attachment 1.

The Step-One Base Figure, weighted by type of work to be performed, is zero (0).

Step-Two Process: Adjustment to the Base Figure

The purpose of the analysis in Step-Two is to make a determination based on relevant evidence available to WCCTA if any adjustments to the Step-One Base Figure are justified. WCCTA's DBE participation history can assist in determining whether an adjustment to the Step-One Base Figure is warranted.

With limited contracting opportunities anticipated in the triennial period 2022-23 through 2024-25, and no DBEs available to perform operations services, adjustments were deemed unnecessary. In addition, during the previous three years this agency did not increase DBE participation with FTA assisted contracts through outreach and business development efforts. Therefore, WCCTA determined, based on relevant evidence available, that an adjustment was unnecessary. The overall Anticipated DBE Goal or the Step-Two Adjusted Figure, is 0%.

Conclusion: The Anticipated Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Goal for FFY 2023-2025 is 0%.



Comments Received:

• How do you address when goals are not met? BOC responded that an agency has to do a shortfall analysis which details the conditions

that prevented the agency from meeting the goal and a corrective action plan detailing how the agency will mitigate future shortfalls. It was also noted that an agency can ask the Federal Transit Administration to approve a singular contract to use race-conscious goals using another agency's disparity study if there are similarities in the contracting opportunities; getting more firms certified as DBEs; and encouraging DBEs to attend pre-proposal conferences to network with prime contractors can assist in meeting goals.

- It was stated that many businesses are not government procurement sound and benefit from business development programs. BOC responded that the BOC provides resources and workshops to assist the DBE and small business community. The BOC also partners with NorCal PTAC and other businesses such as SCORE to promote the free resources available to assist DBEs and small businesses. Many larger transit agencies also offer business development programs.
- A participant who works with DBEs in the Central Valley stated that he wanted to offer similar public participation outreach as the BOC to the Central Valley and was interested in attending future BOC outreach events. The BOC shared a Federal Transit Administration YouTube channel and the U.S. Department of Transportation's "DBE Community of Practice Training Sessions" as additional resources.

On March 8, 2022, an electronic invitation letter to Community Based Organizations (CBOs) was sent to 90 e-mails. The invitation was also

distributed via U.S. Postal mail on March 10, 2022, by Tri Delta Transit. Various trade groups, minority, women's and general contractor groups, community organizations, and technical resource groups from the San Francisco Bay Area were invited such as the African American, Asian, Black, Hispanic, Filipino, Japanese, American Indian Chambers of Commerce; the Bay Area Builders Exchange, the San Francisco Builders Exchange and the Sacramento Builders Exchange; the U.S. Small Business Administration; National Association of Women Business Owners San Francisco Bay Area Chapter and Silicon Valley Chapter; Marin Builders Association; Veterans Business Outreach Center; National Organization of Minority Architects San Francisco Chapter; Women in Consulting San Francisco Chapter; Department of General Services Office of Small Business Certification and Resources; National Association of Women in Construction; American Subcontractors Association; Small Business Development Centers; and NorCal Procurement Technical Assistance Center (PTAC). A total of 4 organizations registered but only two were present. Representation from Norcal PTAC and the U.S. Small Business Administration attended the consultation session.

BOC Questions for Discussion:

The BOC asked questions to get feedback on issues within the DBE/SBE community, challenges to the DBE program, and how agencies can better assist DBEs/SBEs. The questions included:

- What are the major barriers for your members in competing for contracting opportunities?
- What trades are there a lack of/plethora of DBE participation?
- What are some recommended strategies to attract and increase DBE participation?
- Do you have suggestions for resources and references that the BOC should develop, maintain, and disseminate to your members?
- How can the Business Outreach Committee assist you in your mission?

Comments Received: Norcal PTAC and SBA

- One of the barriers is that some of the primes are reluctant to use DBE certified firms because they are new and/or don't have prior experience.
- Pre-proposal conferences are good for DBE firms to meet the primes and see what requirements are for projects.
- SBA does liaison work with federal agencies and would like to support outreach efforts and information sharing to help reach the small business community.
- Most of the agencies that are federally funded do not have a procurement feature for vendors to "opt in" or post a vendor ad to reach a prime for a construction or professional services contract.
- Why have the majority of transit agencies not listed their DBE goals? A response was provided that several agencies were still finalizing their proposed goals and there is another BOC Public Participation Meeting scheduled for April 26, 2022 and that MTC and

VTA would also host a Public Participation Meeting on June 7, 2022 that would include additional transit agencies.

- How many of the transit agencies that receive over \$100 million dollars conducted a disparity study? A response was provided that BART, VTA and Golden Gate Bridge, Highway, and Transportation District were doing a disparity study. It was noted that a disparity study is a challenge as it costs approximately \$1/2 to 3/4 of a million dollars and takes on average 3 years to complete.
- NorCal PTAC encouraged transit agencies to use them as a resource to assist small businesses.

The BOC offered two separate Public Participation meetings held via the Cisco Webex Platform on April 11 and April 26, 2022. The meetings were open to the public to receive comments and questions on the overall goal setting process, discuss the proposed projected DBE goals from each participating agency, and answer any questions or concerns. The BOC distributed an electronic invitation and event flyer to approximately 9354 businesses. Comments Received:

- After the goal setting is done, do any agencies follow up with resource availability for the DBE contractor? Different types of assistance are needed for the different markets and subcontractors. An example was given that many DBE subcontractors do not know how to estimate. More assistance in the form of teaching, classes, etc. needs to be given to the DBE community so they learn how to be competitive and get bids. BOC responded stating that technical assistance and DBE supportive services are offered by the BOC. Some challenges are getting firms to participate, but the BOC will definitely look into offering more assistance.
- It was stated that an RFP for professional services is oftentimes less likely to be shown on the transit agencies websites versus capital projects and it is more challenging to find out who will be a prime when you are trying to get on a team. It was also stated that there are financial burdens in professional services. The commenter asked if there are trainings that can be offered to DBEs to get past some of the professional services challenges for developing bids? Lastly, the commenter stated that there are some agencies that have very high goals and many of the agency goals seem low. BOC responded that the BOC will offer trainings for professional services and look into what some of the barriers may be. The reason that goals may be low is that it depends on what types of contracts that are

included in the projected goal and the availability of DBEs for the contracts.

- It was stated that the mentoring and protégé program at Caltrans is a great place to network with primes and get educational opportunities. There is also a VTA supply and diversity program. It was advised that DBEs register for these programs. It was suggested that money needs to be set aside at each agency for DBE education programs on how to maneuver in the government contracting arena. Many DBEs do not understand how to do estimating and how to get a contract with a prime.
- It was stated that emerging A&E firms have a difficult time forming relationships with primes because teams are formed in advance. Many primes are hesitant to work with a smaller DBE firm.
- I appreciate all of you setting goals for us DBE's. Very often we would not otherwise have an opportunity to participate on these projects. These requirements open the doors for us.
- I encourage all agencies to continue to focus on supportive services to bolster tradespersons starting business, residential contractors moving into the public works arena, and firms seeking to grow. Working in the public works arena requires a unique skill set and we need to continue to support the DBE firms that are working for your agencies.

bring with them. The industry can capitalize on the shifting job market if opportunities are communicated well.





Doing Business with Bay Area Transit Agencies

The Business Outreach Committee (BOC) is a conglomeration of Bay Area transit and transportation agencies working together to assist Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBEs) and Small Business Enterprises (SBEs) through training, providing technical assistance, and relationship-building with agency staff and the contracting community of the San Francisco Bay Area.

DBE programs are required by the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), and as recipients of DOT funding, transportation agencies are required to:

- · Adopt DBE programs and policies
- Establish overall and contract-specific DBE and SBE goals
- · Encourage utilization of certified DBE firms and
- Act as a resource to DBEs and SBEs

Some agencies have also adopted SBE and/or Local Business Enterprise (LBE) Programs that apply to non-federally and federally-funded procurements and contracts.

How the BOC Can Help

BOC members can:

- Explain DBE, SBE, and LBE program goals and needs
- Alert you about upcoming Invitations for Bids (IFB) and Requests for Proposals (RFP) at individual agencies
- Answer questions about specific bid opportunities
- Offer DBE certification classes for your area
- Provide contact information of prime contractors on specific jobs
- Add your firm to appropriate bidders' lists
- Help you locate support services
- Assist DBE, SBE and LBE firms with agency contracts

What is a DBE?

A DBE is defined as:

- · A for-profit small business concern
- At least 51 percent owned and controlled by one or more individuals who are both socially and economically disadvantaged. Such individuals could be Black Americans, Hispanic Americans, Native Americans, Asian-Pacific Americans, Subcontinent Asian Americans, Women, and any additional groups on a case-by-case basis
- Personal net worth does not exceed \$1.32 Million

How to Get Certified as DBE Firm

Most of the BOC agencies participate in the California Unified Certification Program (CUCP), which offers "one-stop shopping" to interested firms. Firms only need to apply to one participating CUCP agency for certification in the state of California. Follow these guidelines to get certified:

- Go to the California Department of Transportation Office of Business & Economic Opportunity at https://dot.ca.gov/programs/civil-rights/dbe-certification-information and check if your firm meets the eligibility criteria as stated in 49 Code of Federal Regulations Part 26.
- Complete the online CUCP DBE Certification Application Package. Reach out to the certifying agency located closest to your primary business location for questions or assistance with the online application process.
- The CUCP certifying agency will determine whether a firm qualifies for DBE certification after a thorough review of the firm's application, documentation and information obtained from an on-site visit.
- A DBE certification issued by one CUCP member will be accepted by all other CUCP member agencies. DBE certifying agencies in the Bay Area are BART, Caltrans, SFMTA, SamTrans, and VTA. A business owned and operated by socially and economically disadvantaged individual(s) does not have to be a certified DBE to bid on or be awarded contracts.
- Contact the staff of any BOC member agency listed below via phone or email for information on their respective agency and/or to receive assistance with procurements.






